We wish to have the Symposium on the following subjects:

- 1. Wages and Prices State responsibility.
- 2. Rights and responsibilities of Civil Servents in a Democratio set-up.

We need hardly say that your participation in the Symposium would be as valuable an instruction and education to Civil Services belonging to all Branches, as it is bound to be of inestimable value to the Administrations in the various States too.

We would be most grateful for your kind acceptance of our request in this behalf to participate in the Symposium. As the period 3rd to 5th January 1960 is only tentatively fixed now, we

would communicate to you very shortly, the exact date on which the Symposium would be held, and in the meanwhile, we would be thankful to you for your kind acceptance of our invitation.

BRIEF NOTE ON THE OBJECTIVES OF THE ALL INDIA CONVENTION OF STATES SERVICES TO BE HELD AT HYDERABAD.

Our Country has accepted as its aim a Socialistic pattern of Society. The administrative set-up of the Government at variou levels is therefore naturally charged with responsibilities, it was not privileged to own before. This pleasant responsibility consist in carrying to fruition, in time and with efficiency and economy, the development programmes evolved by the "Flammers".

It is not infrequently that delay in despatch of business in Govt. Departments is complained of, or the page of progress on works is thwarted for some reason or other. The malady is, more often than not, traceable to the almost unquestioned continuance of the age-old patterns of administrative machinery with too much compartmentalisation and too little scope for co-ordination. In the existing set-up, the conditions of service, the scales of pay, the methods of work, and not the least of all, personnel management all these differ from State to State, and again as between the States and the Centre.

Reforms in the Educational system - at the Scholastic, Vocational and Collegiate branches - are a felt need, and these naturally have to be dealt with on a Mational level. The extent to which the desired reformation can be successfully brought about has, doubtless, a direct bearing on the position and status assigned to a "Teacher" in the Society at large.

If the Civil Services of the Country are to reflect the dynamism of the progressive policies of our Independent India — as they ought to — it is only necessary that an entirely new outlook is brought to bear on all the above aspects. Problems which are common to all the States are best tackled on a Sational level, in order that to produce really effective results. The crux of the whole was problem lies in ironing out the existing diversities and forging natural and really efficient units of administration in the Country. This will also help building up the cherished motional integration in its true spirit and content. Emotional integration which does not spread its healthy influence on the Services is, to say the least, not complete, and connot yield the expected results.

A beginning has to be made to bring about the transformation. The most appropriate Forum to make a modest beginning in this Mational task, as far as the Services Foreonnel, at any rate, are concerned, would be for all the Organisations in the various States to meet in a Convention., in order to set at a forthright appraisal of their common problems, and to spotlight remedial measures. The broad objectives of the proposed Convention therefore is to have at first hand, a free exchange of information among the particle pating Organisations, particularly on all the above and allied aspects of common and Mational interest, with the determination to suggest measures to eliminate existing lacuna, to keep page with the changed objectives of Society and Administration.

The Convention will direct its energies to this end.




