Re. the TA Bill, I am informed that you will be getting the cheque in a day or two.

2. We are pursuing the dispute in Cochin Docks here with the Labour Ministry. We think it would be useful if the State Government is also moved in the matter since the dispute is unnecessarily prolonging because of the obstinacy of Mr Menon, the Cochin Port Chairman. The State Govt is also represented on the Dock Labour Board. So if the Labour Commissioner as well as the Governor are contacted from the STUC, that would facilitate an early settlement.
