Respected Swamiji,

Received your letter together with a letter from a few members of the STUC Executive Committee and Com. Anshilal. These letters were received by me on 18.5.64 when I returned from outside.

Comrades have asked for an Executive meeting. Of course a meeting is being called, but those who now demand the meeting and say that they have been verbally asking for it, are absolutely wrong. A meeting of the Executive under our constitution has to be held once in 4 months at least and same has been regularly held since I took over charge of this post.

A meeting of the Executive Committee will be called and held within 15 days of the date on which the requisition was received by me. This is required under our constitution when one third members demand such a meeting. While the requisition is not in accordance yet the same is being called and agenda issued in a day or two. Of course the date suggested by this comrade does not suit me, therefore, it is being called on a different date.

Dear Comrade,

Recently various serious controversies have arisen in the STUC. Some comrades are openly bringing up the controversies of CPI in the STUC, even rival unions are supported. Now they have decided to change the Secretary of STUC. A rival office of STUC has been set up in the old Party office.

Two meetings of STUC executive Committee have been convened one by me on 13.6.64 at Jaipur in Government Hostel Room no 18 of Shri Kedarnath MLA vice-President of STUC. This meeting is scheduled to start at 2.30 P.M. Swamyji, President of STUC has called another to be held at Jaipur on 16.6.64 in the office of CPI in control of Com. H K Uyas. As you know that we had talks about AITUC work in Rajasthan, wherein it was understood that we will not allow these controversies in TU work and its unity will not be allowed to be impaired. But just the opposite is happening here on the initiative of these comrades who hold different views than me. I have written to Swamyji to prevent such a situation and agree to a common date and place for STUC meeting, but it is my apprehension that he may not prove very effective. I am still anxious to prevent such a development i.e. disunity - if for that I am prepared that all the matters may be settled mutually. But if the process continues and I am forced then I will have to fight back and no doubt successfully.

Decisions of the meeting of the Working Committee of the Rajasthan State Committee of the AITUC held at Jaipur on the 19th June 1964.

\*\*\*\*\*

This meeting of the Executive of the Rajasthan State Committee of the AITUC discussed the organisational position in the Trade Union movement obtaining in the State and has unanimously arrived at the following steps:

1. The Office Bearers and the Executive Committee elected at the Udaipur Conference and the subsequent cooptions made at Benwar Convention legally and validly constitute the Executive Committee of the Rajasthan State Committee of the AITUC. To remove all doubts concerning this the list of office bearers and executive committee members is attached herewith. The President Swami Kumaranand, the two Vice Presidents Kedarnath Sharma and Ashraf Poudar, the General Secretary Mohan Poonamiya, and the two Joint Secretaries Rohanlal and Avinash Chandra Lata, of the Rajasthan State Committee will look after the day to day work of the State Committee Centre, give guidance to the movement, and prepare for the Provincial Conference. In fact they will act as the Secretariat of the State TUC, they alone will act as the spokesmen of the State TUC. In case of serious differences of opinion in the Secretariat, the matter will be referred to the AITUC Secretariat whose decisions will be final.

2. The State Conference of the Rajasthan State TUC will be held at Jaipur in the third week of August 1964. Invitees, reports, resolutions, questions of scrutiny of delegates, exact date of Conference etc will be decided by the Secretariat constituted above.

3. The next meeting of the Executive Committee will be called convened by the Secretariat. No requisition meeting will be called by any member or members.

4. All comrades of the Executive Committee pledge to carry out the decisions of the Executive Committee and the directions given by the Secretariat.

5. No member of the Executive Committee will raise or support any objection regarding the constitutional validity of the decisions taken above in any shape or form.

6. A Press Communiqué regarding the proceedings of the meeting will be issued over the signatures of Swamiji and Comrade Poonamiya.
