

We would like to inform you that M/s Sodepore Cotton Mills Ltd., Sodepore, 24-parganas, has most illegally and arbitrarily locked out their factory with the motive of crushing the solidarity of the workers and their Workers' Union, with effect from the 13th December, 1965.

All attempts at a peaceful settlement through conciliatory methods have proved to be fruitless. The management has also stopped payment of wages to the workers from 1st December, 1965.

The workers are determined to fight against the unfair labour practice and illegal action of the management.

We earnestly hope that we shall be favoured with all your active cooperation, financial assistance and valuable advice in these circumstances so as to ensure success in our struggle against the vindictiveness and unfair labour practice of the aforesaid management.

সোদপুর কটন মিলে বে-আইনী লক-আউট শ্রমিকদের সাহায্য করুন

গত ১৩ই ডিসেম্বর হইতে বারাকপুর শিল্পাঞ্চলের সোদপুর কটন মিল লক-আউট হইয়া আছে। ফলে সাড়ে চারিশত শ্রমিক বেকার হইয়াছেন। তাঁহাদের পরিবারবর্গ সহ প্রায় আড়াই সহস্র মানুষ অনশন ও অর্ধাশনের মধ্যে দিন কাটাইতেছেন। আজিকার দুম্বলোর বাজারে কর্মরত শ্রমিকের জীবন-যাত্রা যেখানে দুর্বহ, সে ক্ষেত্রে বেকার শ্রমিকের অবস্থা কী হইতে পারে, সকলে অনুমান করিতে পারেন।

এই লক-আউটের ফলে কেবল যে শ্রমিকেরাই ক্ষতিগ্রস্ত হইতেছেন তাহাই নয়, উৎপাদন বন্ধ হওয়ার ফলে জাতীয় আয় জাতীয় সম্পদ হ্রাস পাইতেছে। এই অবস্থা সত্ত্বেও আমরা লক্ষ্য করিতেছি, শ্রমিক ও জাতীয় স্বার্থের দিকে তাকাইয়া উৎপাদন অব্যাহত রাখার প্রয়োজনে মিল চালু করা এবং শ্রমিকদের বেকারত্বের অবসানের জন্ত সরকার কোন উদ্যোগ লইতেছেন না। সরকারের এই নীতির ফলেই মালিক বে-আইনীভাবে মিল লক-আউট করা সত্ত্বেও উৎসাহ বোধ করিতেছে, প্রশ্রয় পাইতেছে।

সোদপুর কটন মিল মালিকের প্রকৃত উদ্দেশ্য, অর্ধেক শ্রমিক ছাঁটাই করিয়া ডবল কাজ করানো। দীর্ঘকাল মিল বন্ধ করিয়া অসহায় শ্রমিককে ছাঁটাই মানিয়া লইতে বাধ্য করার জন্তই তাহারা এই হীন পথ বাছিয়া লইয়াছে।

মালিকের এই দুর্ভিসন্ধি ব্যর্থ করিতে পারে, শ্রমিক ও অত্যাচার জন সাধারণের ঐক্যবদ্ধ আন্দোলন এবং সক্রিয় সহানুভূতি। লক-আউট, ছাঁটাই, লে-অফ সমস্ত আজ শুধুমাত্র সোদপুর মিলেরই নয়, এই সমস্তা সকল সূতাকলে সকল কারখানায় আসিতেছে। অতএব এই সংগ্রাম সমগ্র মেহনতী মানুষ ও জন-সাধারণের সংগ্রাম। আমরা আশা করি, পানীহাটী তথা সমগ্র পশ্চিম বাংলার মেহনতী মানুষ এই সংগ্রামে সক্রিয় অংশ গ্রহণের জন্ত আগাইয়া আসিবেন।



Respected sir,

We, the employees of M.W.B. International Ltd, Inc (B.T.P.S) were argued for the profit Bonus - consiquently six months. But our company attorney had been refused our proposal. At last our action Committee had been conducted an hunger strike from 16/3/66.

Mr. S.R. Sharma, Committee Conveenor was on hunger strike. At the fourth day of his hunger strike the Deputy Labour Commissioner, West Bengal has conducted a Conciliation at the presents of Mr. Arun Sen. As the result of the conciliation a settlement was reached on the following terms:

Terms of Settlement -

It is agreed that the company will pay an advance amounting to six weeks wages against the claim of Bonus of the workers for the year ending 31st December, 1964 and for the year ending 31st December, 1965.

This advance payment will be adjusted against the amount which is found due as bonus for the two years, 1964 and 1965, after the balance sheet is scrutinised and examined by the Labour Directorate along with the parties concerned. For the year 1964 the company will submit to this Directorate their audited & balance sheet within two weeks from the date of this settlement.

This payment of advance will be completed by the company on or before the 31st March 1966.

Any dispute regarding the payment of bonus for the above two years to the retrenched workers of the company will be referred to Shri S.N. Roy, Dy. Labour Commissioner, for a decision.

In view of this agreement the workers agree to call off the hunger strike and other forms of agitation immediately.



Re: Clarification of the Provision of Bonus
Act No.34(3) in relation to Income Tax Laws.

Divergent views are being expressed as to whether, after the passing of Bonus Act 1965, a payment of Bonus exceeding the ceiling of 20% under a separate agreement between employer and employees would be allowed as a charge against the profits of a company.

We, the employees of Messrs. Shaw Wallace & Co.Ltd., Calcutta were entitled to eight months' basic pay (much higher than 20% gross wages) as bonus in 1965 in terms of an agreement entered into in 1957. But the Bonus Ordinance upset that arrangements and despite its initial attempt to limit the bonus to 20%, the employees' movement compelled the company to come to an adhoc settlement for 1965 where they agreed to pay 6.75 months' basic (higher than 20%) immediately and the balance 1.25 months after the passing of Bonus Act provided there was no risk of penalty or tax disallowance. It was also agreed that a fresh agreement in line with the previous one would be contracted if allowed by the Bonus Act and the excess payment was allowed as justifiable expenditure in respect of Income Tax assessment.

As no clarification or authentic opinion has yet been received despite representations, our legal dues of last year and the contract of a new agreement have been withheld by the Company. We are also feeling helpless because of Govt's silence.

In the circumstances, we solicit your assistance and would request you to raise the issue in the Parliament and obtain clarification from the Ministry of Finance, which will not only help us but many others whose cases are hanging in uncertainty over this issue.

We shall feel highly obliged if you kindly take the trouble of forwarding at an early date Govt's reply if given against your question.

I am in receipt of your letter dated 8th inst. regarding clarification of the Bonus Act. According to my interpretation Sec. 34(3) does not debar workers from receiving bonus in excess of 20% provided it is under a settlement. As you are aware there is as yet no case law and each party has to depend upon its own interpretation.

The clarification is to be sought not from the Ministry of Finance but from the Labour Ministry. Under Section 37 you can secure such clarification. I have written the enclosed letter on this point to the Ministry of Labour.

**RESOLUTION ADOPTED IN A GENERAL MEETING OF CINEMA EMPLOYEES HELD ON
11.7.66 AT RAJA SUBODH MULLICK SQUARE ;**

"This meeting notes with grave concern that the Cinema employers' Association (EIMPA) has not yet done anything effective to enforce the tri - partite agreement of 10.4.66 in full in many Cinemas. Many Cinemas have not only not paid the arrear overtime wages but they are also not paying current overtime wages which became payable as per the terms of the agreement dt. 10.4.66.

Overtime and above that - the claims put forward by the Union to raise the D.A. of all workmen by 85% of the total wages and to merge the old D.A. in Basic wages have not yet been accepted by the Cinema employers. To concretise ~~the demand~~ this demand, the Union claims D.A. at the Metro Cinema's rates in all Airconditioned Cinemas.

The provocative position taken W/S. Santosh Talkies, W/S. Sri Rupa Cinema, W/S. Chandl Talkies, W/S. Surya House (Berhampur), W/S. Sibar Talkies, Bethadahari, still continues - causing daily mounting discontent among the work

"This meeting, therefore, feels it necessary to caution the employers in the seriousmost terms that - if all the Cinema employers do not change their attitude immediately (even after the categorical order issued by Hon'ble C.J. Justice on 8.7.66 limiting the whole matter, that too in a truncated way, in the appellants only) and if they do not come forward to agree to settle the above-mentioned disputes within the shortest possible time - the employers & their Association would remain responsible for the most unhappy development that are bound to take place within a very short period of time.

"This meeting also urges upon the State Government Labour Ministry to intervene for settling the unfortunate disputes created by the employers and to use their good offices in raising the D.A. of the workers in view of the daily mounting prices which has been accentuated by their mad act of devaluation of the rupee.

"This meeting also likes to impress upon the Government that any delay in settling the disputes satisfactorily would leave no other way open to the workers but to take recourse to direct actions including strikes".



CONVENTION OF JUTE WORKERS FOR BONUS

A convention under the auspices of Bengal Chatkal Mazdoor Union, attended by more than 200 delegates from almost all the jute centres, was held on 9th January 1966 at Muslim Institute Hall, under the Chairmanship of Sri Chatur Ali.

By a resolution, moved by Sri Bhowani Roy Choudhury, General Secretary of the Union, the Convention condemned the pro-employer modification of Bonus Act and demanded its immediate amendment in the interest of the workers. The Convention expressed regret for refusal of the jute mill owners to pay bonus for the year 1963 as per Bonus Act. Even the Balance sheets and the calculations of the companies have not been submitted for examination for the years 1964. The convention demanded immediate payment of Bonus for the years 1963 (i.e. 1963-64) as per Bonus ~~law~~ Act and submission of the balance sheets with calculation for the year 1964 (i.e. 1964-65). If no settlement is arrived at within 31st January 1966, the Convention authorised the Executive Committee to negotiate with other unions for an agreed date of strike and to serve the strike notice.

Resolutions greeting the Tashkent Summit meeting, Demanding Release of the Political prisoners, Demanding extension of Statutory Rationing ~~in~~ covering all the industrial workmen with 3300 gms. per head per week ~~xxxxx~~ cereal and condemning ESI administration for utter mismanagement in supply of medicines and delay in payment of cash benefit and hospitalisation, demanding withdrawal of proposed meeting and procession control bill, ~~xxxx~~ against Price Index fraud.

Altogether 15 delegates participated in the discussion of the resolutions.

RESOLUTION ON BONUS

This convention of jute workers held under the auspices of BENGAL CENTRAL MAZDOOR UNION strongly condemns the Govt. of India's pro-employer modification of the majority recommendations of the Bonus Commission while enacting Bonus law.

Even the meagre benefit granted by the recent Bonus law has been denied to the jute workers. The Convention views with grave concern the IJMA's adamant attitude in the matter of payment of Bonus for the financial year starting on any day in the year 1963 as per provision of Sec. 43 of the Payment of Bonus Act, 1965. The Balance sheets for the accounting year starting on any day in 1964 have even not been supplied to the Unions though agreed upon.


This Convention deplores the State Government's dilatory attitude in the matter of settling the vital disputes of two and a half lakh jute workers.

The Convention calls upon the jute workers of West Bengal to register their strongest protest unitedly against the ~~Government~~ / Govt. & of the ~~Union~~ IJMA for ~~its~~ refusal to concede the just demands of the jute workers and for raising demands of :

- i) Amendment of the Bonus Act in the interest of the workers;
- ii) Immediate payment of Bonus as per Bonus Act for 1963, 63-64;
- iii) Immediate submission of Balance sheets with calculation for Bonus, to the Unions, for the year 1964, 1964-65.

This convention warns the State Govt. ~~that~~ and the IJMA that unless the aforesaid demands are immediately acceded to the jute workers will have no other course but to resort to all forms of trade union actions including General strike.

The Convention hereby authorises the Executive Committee of BENGAL CENTRAL MAZDOOR UNION to conduct negotiation with other Unions to fix up ~~the~~ /an agreed date of the strike if the demands are not conceded within 31st of January 1966.
