Dear Brothers,

As its last session (Peking, June 1960), the General Council of the World Federation of Trade Unions noted that in many capitalist countries, the monopolies and governments are organising violent attacks against trade union rights and democratic liberties. Many trade union leaders have been arrested and imprisoned, dozens of strikers have fallen victim to persecution by the police and the employers.

This offensive against the trade unions has been accompanied by the promulgation of new laws which tend to legalise infringements on basic rights, such as the right to strike, which are set forth in the Charter of the Workers' Trade Union Rights, adopted by the W.F.T.U. in 1954.

In view of these attacks, the General Council has instructed the Secretariat of the W.F.T.U. to consult all organisations concerned on the formation of an international trade union commission to defend and safeguard victims of trade union persecution. This commission should be united and have a study and consultative nature in order to assist action in defence of trade union rights, wherever necessary.

So as to make its work more effective, the commission should be composed of trade union leaders from various parts of the world as well as of lawyers with an international reputation who are likely to take an active part in defending victims of trade union persecution. The W.F.T.U. has already contacted the International Association of Democratic Lawyers with the request to designate some lawyers.

Fully aware of the interest your centre shows in all problems concerning trade union rights, we take pleasure in inviting you to participate in the work of this commission by appointing a trade union leader whose authority and competence in the matter would allow him to make an effective contribution to the work of the commission.

The Secretariat of the W.F.T.U. plans to hold the first meeting of the commission during the first half of February, 1961, in Prague.

Hoping to receive a favourable reply to our request, we send you fraternal trade union greetings.

I hope your health is better.

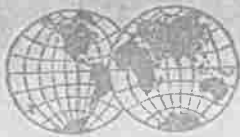

On receiving the telegram and the trunk talk with you, I came to Calcutta to-day. I met the Regional Passport Officer who informed me that ~~the telegram~~ he had received a telegraphic message but that only results in the rejection of my application. I am sending you the original copy of the letter as also an appeal against it. The R. P. O. has, however, promised to send my file to Delhi to-day & it is expected that the file will reach there to-morrow. Even if ~~you~~ you think it proper to make further attempts my appeal to the Chief Passport Officer is attached herewith in original so as to enable you to take measures. If something is done to-morrow & the R. P. O. is directed to issue the same by sending the file to-morrow itself then I can get the passport on 10/3 to start from Calcutta. I am staying at Calcutta for your further instructions. my address will be:

Another difficulty in this connection will be that the Sponsors had instructed that I should fly by 7/3. But now if even if I get the passport on 10/3 they cannot allow me to avail of the ticket. On my request, they have, however, agreed to consult the sponsors in Rome. So certain measures in this respect ~~may also~~ should be taken, if the APUC decides that I should start even as late as 10/3.

I shall be waiting for a reply from you. Please send an express letter in the address given. I am also sending a signed blank paper to make application in the appeal to Chief Passport Officer, if necessary. In any case please inform me what you decide though you must be very busy with other work.

After receipt of your letter, I requested Com. Indrajit to go to Chief Passport Officer. His inquiry revealed that the Bihar Special Branch fellows have at the last moment sent an objection for the grant of passport to you.

But subsequent talks yielded the result that Indrajit will today send a letter to CPO making a personal recommendation for the grant of passport to you. He has also stated that the meeting has reported to have been postponed for about 10 days.

Your appeal to CPO has also been sent. If you receive the passport, then we would ask the WFTU to validate your ticket.

You wait for a few days in Calcutta. Let us see what happens.

Dear Sir,

This is with reference to the passport application of Shri Ratan Roy, Secretary, Bihar State Committee of the All-India Trade Union Congress, who is a delegate from India to the meeting of the Commission on Trade Union Rights in Prague, Czechoslovakia.

I am told his passport application has been rejected by the Regional Passport Officer, Calcutta, but no reasons have been given for the rejection. Shri Roy informs me that he has already appealed to you for reconsideration of his application.

As you are certainly aware, various Commissions and Conferences dealing with international trade union problems are frequently arranged by the World Federation of Trade Unions at Prague and elsewhere, and Indian delegates, nominated by the AITUC, have regularly been attending these meetings. Shri Ratan Roy who is a prominent trade unionist of long standing has also been selected in the normal course to attend the meeting mentioned earlier, and it is certainly surprising that passport facilities should be refused to him by the RPO, Calcutta.

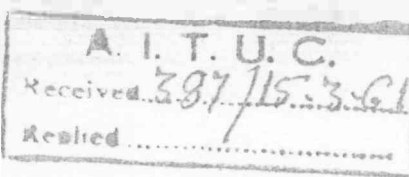

I hope you must have received my acknowledgement letter for your kind selection of me to the study course at Tashkent. ~~The~~ I was completely new to this passport business. yet by now I have come to know the whole procedure including the latest modifications published in the Orissa Gazette of 10-3-61. I secured the passport forms from the Dist. Magistrate's Office in duplicate + a special slip asking for my particulars + A special form in triplicate meant for study courses. In Rourkela I could not get copies of my photograph before 2 days. Then got four copies of my photograph attested by the Deputy Collector here in his court. Remitted the fees of Rs. 15/- to Regional P.O. Calcutta. As per the amended procedure I have to submit the originals to the Dist. Magistrate and the Duplicates to the R.P.O. Calcutta simultaneously. I have filled up all the forms. The original will be in the hands of the Dist. Magistrate by in the first hours of his office tomorrow i.e. 21st. After returning from there I will catch the night mail tomorrow and will deliver the Duplicates to the R.P.O. at Calcutta on 22nd. at any rate.

During my talks with the concerned staff of the Dist. Magistrate they told me that they can complete their enquiries within six days and send the originals to Calcutta after that. I shall write to you again from Calcutta on 22nd.

In essence it serves the purpose. Sundergarh, Orissa and another to R.P.O. Cal, so that delay can be avoided. I therefore request you to think and decide on this matter as you know more than me in these matters. May be it may not be necessary.

I am thinking of emplaning at Delhi after meeting you. kindly inform me as to when I have to emplane, so that I will arrange to reach there before that. If possible kindly ask the UNESCO representative at Delhi to pursue the matter of my passport from time to time with the R.P.O. Calcutta, as well as the External Affairs ministry.

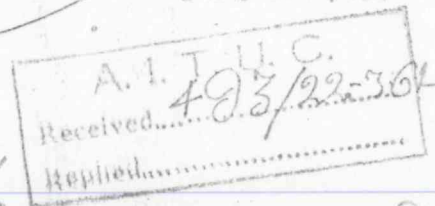

Namastkar, I hope you must have received the telegram I sent to you yesterday night. Yesterday noon I reached Calcutta and straight went to the Regional passport officer and delivered to him the original passport papers from the District Magistrate's office. So the worst part of the work, i.e. the Police and D.M.'s approval has been obtained. The Calcutta R.P.O. after going through my papers told me that he will give me the passport only after getting instructions from the Chief passport officer of External Affairs Ministry at Hero's Share Road, New Delhi or from the Under Secretary (PV). You know that the last plane before the study course starts on 9th is on 5th and 6th April. During this small interval I must get the passport to reach Tashkent in time.

I therefore request you to place the above situation before

Comrade Dange and seek his immediate intervention with the External Affairs Ministry and the Chief Passport officer and pursue the matter till telegraphic instructions are issued from Delhi to the Calcutta Passport officer. In case Comrade Dange will not be there, then you may take the help of com. Hiren Mukherji, or com. Renu Chakravarty or com. Indrajit Gupta or ^{com. V. K. Chakravarty} or M.P. you think proper.

Following our invitation we have also sent him an air ticket Patna-New-Delhi-Prague and back. Unfortunately, Brother Ratan Roy did not reach Prague and we remained without any news from him.

We therefore have given orders to the Travelling Office to withdraw the ticket we had sent.


But today, the Travelling Office informs us that it can't withdraw the ticket as it has been used by Br. Ratan Roy. Here are the indications: Brother Roy has taken the ticket and took, on March 7, the flight 412 IAC from Patna to New-Delhi. There, on the basis of the indications given by the Travelling Office, he took the flight number 107 Air India for Europe on March 8.

As Brother Roy did not reach Prague, the part of the ticket covering New-Delhi Prague and back to Patna has surely not been used.

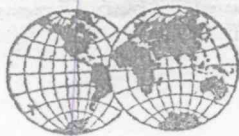

Lous Saillant, General Secretary WFTU sent the following telegram to President Kennedy on November 22, protesting against the application of the McCarran Act in U.S.A.

"The World Federation of Trade Unions on behalf of its 107 million adherents energetically protests against the decisions taken on June 5, 1961, by the United States Supreme Court for application of the McCarran Act. The application of this law which is contrary to the United States Constitution involves vicious penalties against those upholding democratic freedoms. While attacking in the first place the communists threaten all progressive people and organisations in the United States which are waging a struggle for the safeguard of peace, for the economic and social demands of the workers and against racial discrimination. Together with all workers and democrats we demand the immediate cancellation of these measures and the repeal of this anti-working class law which deliberately violates the freedoms and rights of the workers as inscribed in the Universal Declaration on Human Rights.

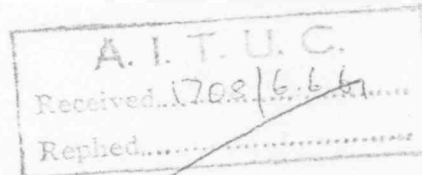

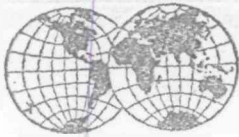

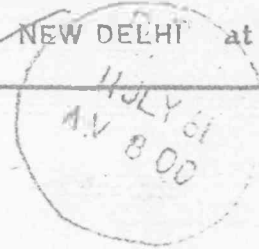

Your letter dated July 11, 1961.

1. The AITUC has been rendering help from time to time to the Indian Mine Workers Federation and particularly for defence of cases.
2. We gave to Com. Kalyan Roy, a sum of Rs.500 on April 29, 1961, for the defence of this particular case under reference.
3. We have allotted a sum of Rs.8000 to 10000 for the miners involved in cases in the Barbil mining area. A copy of the letter which we have addressed to the comrades in Orissa regarding their demand for aid is enclosed herewith for your information, just to show you how the problems of defence stand. About 38 miners are involved in this case.
4. The vast number of cases arising out of the Jamshedpur Steel strike have now closed. We allotted them over Rs.24,000.
5. The cases, arising out of the mining areas of Gua, were rendered aid to the extent of Rs.9000. The leading comrades have been acquitted, while some miners have been sentenced to long terms of imprisonment.

A fuller report with all details can be made available, if desired.

In giving aid, we generally help extensively those cases, which involve murder or very serious assaults and injuries leading to sentences of death or long term imprisonment. Such cases are very serious in character and involve much expenditure. Hence, we give them special attention.

Ordinary cases, arising out of strikes or violation of laws, generally looked after by the unions themselves. Such cases arise every year and number by thousands. Obviously, the AITUC or the WFTU cannot look after so many of them.

All this is apart from solidarity aid given in strike struggles.

We are also communicating with Com. Kalyan Roy on this question and your letter.

Dear Brother Dange,

I wish to inform you that the question of granting the W.F.T.U. consultative status with the International Atomic Energy Agency will again be raised at the General Conference of the I.A.E.A. which opens in Vienna on September 26.

As you will remember, at its session in September 1960, the General Assembly of the I.A.E.A. confirmed the decision of the General Council of Governors, refusing to grant the W.F.T.U. consultative status.

I would ask you to see how you could approach the government delegation of your country to the forthcoming I.A.E.A. session, and explain the interest which the W.F.T.U. holds in consultative status. This status has been granted to the I.C.F.T.U., the I.F.C.T.U. and other organisations less representative than the W.F.T.U. which has 107 million members and is the only international trade union organisation rallying workers in capitalist, socialist and newly developing countries.

It is obvious that this decision of the I.A.E.A. is of a discriminatory nature and was dictated by political motives raised by the United States government and its accomplices.

We are enclosing a document stating our reasons in support of the request for consultative status with the I.A.E.A.

The interest taken by the W.F.T.U. in the peaceful utilisation of atomic energy and in the activities of the International Atomic Energy Agency

The interest which the World Federation of Trade Unions takes in the work of the specialised agencies of the U.N. in general and of the I.A.E.A. in particular arises from its constitutional aims and its character as a world trade union organisation, called upon to participate and be consulted wherever and whenever matters affecting the interests of the broad working masses are being discussed and decided. That is why the W.F.T.U. enjoys consultative status in the following organisations: Economic and Social Council of the U.N. (ECOSOC), International Labour Organisation, UNESCO and FAO.

It is obvious that the wider use of atomic energy in industry, science and medicine can bring about a substantial improvement in the living standards of the workers and people throughout the world. The W.F.T.U. therefore maintains that anything which can be done, notably by the I.A.E.A. to encourage the peaceful utilisation of atomic energy, is of extreme importance and should be supported by trade union organisations, which have the duty to wage a continuous campaign for the improvement of the workers' living and working conditions.

On the other hand, the growing number of workers employed in atomic industries, in the extraction, stocking, handling and transportation of radio-active products, increasingly gives rise to serious problems as far as work safety and health standards for the protection of the workers' against atomic radiation are concerned.

Tremendous tasks fall to the trade unions in protecting the workers against such risks.

In this respect, the trade unions affiliated to the W.F.T.U., the W.F.T.U. itself and the T.U.Is., have accumulated a host of valuable experience which could be passed on to the I.A.E.A.

The production, distribution and utilisation of atomic energy affect various aspects of the conditions of workers who are exposed to radiation. These aspects include, in particular:

- working methods and measures against risks, accidents and industrial diseases;
- hours of work (their spacing out and, above all, their reduction);
- holidays (longer ones in general);

- vocational training;
- protection of women and young workers;
- more adequate social security, especially a lower retirement age.

The Soviet Union, which makes extensive use of atomic energy for peaceful purposes, as demonstrated by Soviet scientific and technical achievements, as well as the other socialist countries, already have an advanced legislation stipulating safety and health measures protecting the workers against the effects of atomic radiation.

Under the terms of the legislation in force in all these countries, the trade unions, which have extensive rights to protect the workers, are qualified to ensure that all legal provisions protecting the workers' health and guaranteeing them healthy working conditions are strictly observed. To this end, they have social security commissions, labour inspectors, and in the event of danger they are entitled to stop the machines.

The W.F.T.U. could co-operate, particularly, in the study and elaboration of regulations to protect workers in the mines, in chemical plants, in atomic power stations and in all places of work where workers are exposed to atomic radiation.

The W.F.T.U. has many experts and advisors on the utilisation of atomic energy for peaceful purposes - scientists, technicians and highly specialised engineers - with the necessary technical qualifications and juridical knowledge of national legislation and regulations governing work under conditions of radiation.

The W.F.T.U. could assist the work of the Agency by providing specialists for assistance missions and other purposes.

The W.F.T.U. through the intermediary of these specialists, could participate in the work of the Agency's many committees which have the task of studying various problems raised by the peaceful utilisation of atomic energy. These specialists could take an extremely active part in the preparation of studies on various problems.

The W.F.T.U., as a world trade union organisation, could make a considerable contribution to the co-ordination of rules and regulations governing the protection of health and safety. Such a contribution would be of particular importance if we remember the recommendation advising the Agency to co-ordinate the work of all bodies dealing with atomic energy for peaceful purposes.

Special importance must be attached to the training of the workers, calling on them to become familiar with all provisions concerning the protection of their health so as to avoid accidents and occupational diseases or, at least, keep down their number.

The training of specialists for protection against radiation is of particular importance. The Agency, in conformity with its Statutes, could play a useful role in this field and the W.F.T.U. is prepared to co-operate in such training.

The importance of technical training and re-training must also be stressed. These are problems to which the W.F.T.U., the T.U.Is. and affiliated National Centres are devoting greatest attention.

Practical proposals based on the experience of organisations belonging to the W.F.T.U. could be drawn up and submitted to the Agency for consideration and an ultimate decision. Moreover, the W.F.T.U. and National Centres could make sure that workers are informed of regulations, recommendations and other decisions taken by the Agency and that these are translated into reality.

The W.F.T.U. is ready to popularise the aims and practical activities of the Agency, in particular with reference to the following:

- promotion of greater practical utilisation of atomic energy and research in this field;
- exchanges of scientific and technical information on the peaceful use of atomic energy;
- exchanges and training of scientists and specialists;
- measures to prevent the use of fission products for military purposes;
- safety standards to protect the workers' health.

The Executive Committee of the W.F.T.U., in an endeavour to underline further the importance it attaches to the peaceful utilisation of atomic energy, decided on December 17, 1959, to form a Trade Union Commission made up of experts in the peaceful utilisation of atomic energy and of active trade unionists who have the necessary knowledge and experience in the protection of workers against radiation.

Later, in application of the decisions of the 4th World Trade Union Congress and of the 11th Session of the General Council in Peking, the W.F.T.U. Secretariat set up an International Trade Union Commission on Social Security including

representatives of trade unions, both affiliated and not affiliated to the W.F.T.U., from the following countries: Ghana, Guinea, Mali, Morocco, Brazil, Chile, China, India, Japan, Lebanon, Finland, France, Italy, Czechoslovakia and the Soviet Union. The activities of the Commission formed on December 17, 1959, will henceforth be carried out by the latter Commission.

The purpose of the Commission is to deal with all matters related to social security which, in principle, should cover all social risks and dangers including prevention, health and work safety, work accidents and occupational diseases, protection of the workers against atomic radiation and so forth.

The Commission held its first meeting in Prague from March 24 to 30, 1961, and prepared a draft Social Security Charter which will be submitted to the 5th World Trade Union Congress (Moscow, December 1961).

The Charter is a highly valuable weapon of the workers in the struggle for the achievement, defence and expansion of social security and, more particularly, for the protection of workers against atomic radiation.

Campaigns by the workers and their trade unions and discussions on the problem of protecting the workers against risks arising from the peaceful use of atomic energy would also be useful for the I.A.E.A.

That is why all the recent steps taken by the W.F.T.U. as well as the campaigns by its affiliated organisations could be an effective contribution to the work of the I.A.E.A.

To carry out our international activity, we would ask you for an outline and the text of the lecture by March 1 at the latest.

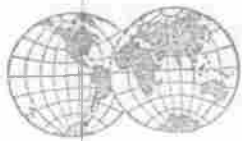
We would appreciate an early reply with the name and address of the lecturer you have chosen so that we may contact him as soon as possible.

We take pleasure in informing you that we are organising a study course on Access of Workers to Education and Culture, in collaboration with UNESCO as part of our educational programme. UNESCO has agreed to assist the organisation of the course.

The Central Council of Soviet Trade Unions has agreed to hold the course in Tashkent, the capital of the Usbekistan Soviet Republic in collaboration with the Usbekistan Council of Trade Unions.

In view of the climate, it was agreed to hold the course during the last three weeks in April (April 9 to 30, 1961). The participants must arrive there on April 5 at the latest.

We, herewith, wish to invite your National Centre to send 1 participant.

Purpose of the course: The purpose of the course is to arrange an exchange of experiences and compare ideas on the workers' access to education and culture and on ways and means of raising the workers' cultural standards.

Standard of the participants: The participants should be responsible trade union officers with experience in education and cultural activities of the workers from various parts of the world, in other words, trade union officers holding posts at various levels dealing with the training and cultural education of workers.

It would be good if their educational standard were sufficiently high allowing them to make their personal contribution to the discussion and derive some benefit from the debates and confrontation of ideas which are to be arranged during the course.

The official languages at the course will be
ENGLISH, SPANISH, FRENCH and RUSSIAN

It is, therefore, essential that they should be in a position to follow proceedings in one of these languages.

Material conditions: Thanks to the hospitality offered by the Central Council of Soviet Trade Unions, the participants will be the guests of the Usbekistan trade unions and will not have to pay anything for their stay.

Please let us know as soon as possible should you encounter any material difficulties (fares, etc.) so that we may take appropriate steps to overcome them.

Many thanks in advance for your contribution to this venture. We hope that in view of the possibilities provided by the course it will also help your work and your participants.

We would appreciate your reply before February 1 and the names of your participants before March 1 so that we may make the necessary organisational arrangements in good time. If we have received no reply before the mentioned dates we shall cancel the invitation which we shall then pass on to another National Centre.

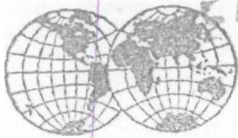
